



Diana Patton After her brother committed suicide, Diana took a long time to forgive herself. She felt responsible for his death, but she cried out to God because she knew she needed to find a way to heal. Through encouragement from her mother and reliance on Scripture, Diana was comforted by God's presence, even during the darkest times. Her relationship with God was what she needed to survive. As she asked God to use her life, Diana found healing when she started helping others and sharing her story.

Now, she takes every day as an opportunity for joy. She shares the love of God with young people who struggle like her brother did. Instead of letting her past define her, she has found freedom from her guilt, and she can walk with purpose.



Ryan Holley Growing up, Ryan was involved in church, but he never really followed God. He was a good person who did the right things, but he was always looking for the approval of others. God was not a priority in his life.

Once he started attending CedarCreek, he made a commitment to know God and live from God's approval, rather than for the approval of others. He wasn't sure about getting baptized, but that changed when he attended Week 1 of GrowthTrack. Ryan had known the host, Paul Dobson, for years, so when Paul shared his story, Ryan felt like God was telling him something. God used Paul, along with the GrowthTrack material, to convince Ryan to get baptized. Finally, Ryan is publicly announcing his commitment to follow Jesus, and his desire to live from God's approval.



Kacy Inafuku When Kacy moved to Ohio, after being raised in Hawaii, she experienced a culture shock. Where everyone in Hawaii was like family, she found Ohio to be isolating. She had trouble making new friends and felt like she didn't belong.

That changed when Kacy joined a Group at CedarCreek. She started connecting with other women in her community. As she became comfortable and opened up, Kacy developed strong friendships that extended into her life outside of the weekly Group meetings.

Now, she leads her own Group for young women, because she never wants anyone else to feel like they don't belong. She wants to create a safe place for these women to study the Bible and find freedom in community.




